ROSARY CLUB**

| <b>SCHOOL</b>          | <b>PROJECT</b>   |
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| <b>Bishop Filevich</b> | Students and staff gather weekly from January to the end of the Great Fast and pray the rosary and the Chotky together. There will be various activities to help the students grow in their knowledge and understanding of these prayers.  |
| <b>Bishop Klein</b>    | Students have the opportunity to come together and pray the Rosary as a community and to pass on the tradition of the Rosary and honor Mary.   |
| <b>Father Robinson</b> | The focus on praying the Rosary will continue to be the main purpose of the prayer room. This year the rosary team will use the living rosary concept by adding beads on the floor so the children are more actively participating in praying the rosary. The story of Fatima will be explored during Rosary Club.   |
| <b>Father Vachon</b>   | During Lent, staff and students will meet on 5 occasions to learn about the rosary and pray the rosary. To build our faith community, a culminating activity will be to take the rosary club to St. Anne's Seniors Home to pray rosary with the seniors at St. Anne's Parish. They will make a craft with and for the seniors. They are asking for funds to bus the students there, if not covered by the grant the CSCC will assist in the transportation cost. |
| <b>Georges Vanier</b>  | Open to Gr. 1-8, led by Gerri Perrault and Klarissa Komarnicki, at lunch hour one day per week during Advent, Lent and the month of May, also lead the Living Rosary for all students.   |

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| <p><b>Holy Mary</b></p>         | <p>Rosary club will meet in October. Living rosary will also occur during the school year. Materials to make a large-scale rosary and materials for regular size rosaries.</p>   |
| <p><b>Holy Trinity</b></p>      | <p>Class sets of rosaries will allow the students to connect physically with prayer and help with the teachings associated with praying the rosary.</p>  |
| <p><b>Pope John Paul II</b></p> | <p>Weekly from January to Easter during lunch. All students are invited. Students will learn the mysteries and how they fit into the prayer sequence of the Rosary.</p>  |
| <p><b>St. Bernard</b></p>       | <p>Students in the Rosary Club will deepen their prayer life through praying the rosary. The club will expand this year with the aim of attracting more middle year's students to serve as mentors and prayer leaders.</p>                           |
| <p><b>St. Dominic</b></p>       | <p>Rosary Club will meet once a week from November – May to pray part of the rosary and learn about the prayers and the mysteries. They will make rosaries and faith-based artwork and write the intentions for the daily morning announcements.</p> |
| <p><b>St. George</b></p>        | <p>All students will participate in rosary club held weekly during Lent. They will come to know the rosary and engage in reflections and activities centered on the prayers and the mysteries of the rosary.</p>                                     |
| <p><b>St. John</b></p>          | <p>Rosary Club is open to students Grade 2 – 8, one month in the spring and one month in the fall. To build relationships with seniors the St. John CWL will be invited to join in when available.</p>   |

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| <p><b>St. Marguerite</b></p>    | <p>Create a gym size wooden rosary to share the Rosary Clubs' message of prayer with the entire student body. This rosary will help make the rosary 'come alive' for students at special events during the liturgical year and especially during Lent.</p>  |
| <p><b>St. Maria Goretti</b></p> | <p>Rosary Club will take place during lunchtime for the Grade 2-4 students with Grades 6-8 student leaders assisting staff. Students will journey to Bethlehem with Mary taking place before and during Advent. In preparation for the birth of Jesus, students will make faith-filled ornaments.</p>   |
| <p><b>St. Mark</b></p>          | <p>Student from K-8 can sign up and join the group in praying the Rosary once a week in the library. Rosaries will be provided to each member of the club who attend 50% or more of the meetings. Rosary cards and booklets will be provided.</p>   |
| <p><b>St. Mary</b></p>          | <p>Wolf Willow Rosary Project – Grade 4-8 students will become familiar with how to pray the rosary and the four mysteries and will construct their own rosary using the traditional Wolf Willow plant, a traditional Metis teaching.</p>   |
| <p><b>St. Peter</b></p>         | <p>Materials purchased will enhance the spiritual understanding of the integrated FNMI and Gospel Virtues of Reconciliation, Justice, Service, Love and Respect, Community, Courage, Hope and Faith. The project is on going throughout the school year for K-2 students. The Gospel Values wooden blocks will be used in classrooms as well as child friendly books that will reflect and explain the gospel values.</p> |

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| <p><b>Sister O'Brien</b></p> | <p>Rosary Club will take place lunch hours during Lent and the Easter season. Students will begin by blessing themselves with Holy Water, by singing Immaculate Mary, offering intentions and then pray a decade of the rosary. During Easter season, Fr. Ramsay blessed the rosaries that the students made.</p>  |
| <p><b>Bethlehem</b></p>      | <p>Students for their personal use and for donation will make rosaries/Chotki to classrooms, nursing homes etc. They will learn to pray the Rosary.</p>  |
| <p><b>St. Joseph</b></p>     | <p>Students and staff pray the rosary Tuesday's at noon in the chapel and then after school Tuesday's meet to make rosaries. These rosaries are given to the Diocesan office and from there are delivered to homebound, the sick, the psychiatric centre, jails, Christmas hampers and other needs. Chapel décor enhancement and supplies such as an Intention Book at the entrance of the chapel.</p> |
