<b>SCHOOL</b>	<b>PROJECT</b>
<b>Bishop Klein</b>	Mary and all the Saints – Called to Saintly Lives. Rosary Club will be created with activities moving within classrooms and cohorts. Students will create rosaries, learn how to pray the rosary, and grow in the faith by deepening their personal relationship with Mary and the Saints. They will explore the bible, catechism, and the rosary. Chaplet materials \$80, rosary materials \$115
<b>Bishop Pocock</b>	Rosary Experiences – Focus of the rosary will be in May. Classroom-based activities, posters of Mary, written reflection on Mary and the Rosary, related crafts and a prayer corner item. Posters \$50, rosaries \$50, Prayer Items \$50, Craft Supplies \$45
<b>Georges Vanier</b>	Rosary Club will meet during the lunch hour once a week during Lent and the month of May to pray the rosary and to understand the role of Mary and the Rosary, to learn the mysteries and their connection to the lives of Mary and Jesus. To deepen student's faith. Booklets \$95, Rosaries \$100
<b>Holy Trinity</b>	Purchase a figurine of the Holy Family to have this focal point on display at the school when reciting the rosary as a school. To enhance an appreciation of the rosary. Figurine cost \$195
<b>Mother Teresa</b>	Living Rosary – Make opportunities to participate in prayerful and meaningful Christ-centered activities. Rosary would be re-used yearly for rosary club or school wide activities. Bowls (to be used as beads) \$177, stone cross \$18

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<b>Pope John Paul II</b>	PJP II Mission & Vision Statements & Prayer Cards – To immerse in biblical language, discover quotes and phrases from PJP. Each classroom teacher will be given a set of prayer cards to leave in places for their students to find to help improve their spiritual and mental health. Supplies \$195
<b>St. Angela</b>	Celebrating the month of May, Rosary Key Chains – Students will learn about the rosary and the prayers, make their own rosary key chain to be blessed by Fr. Matthew. String \$50, Bead \$60, Key Rings \$55, Pockets \$30
<b>St. Augustine</b>	Rosaries in Every Room – Large rosaries will be purchased for some classrooms and class sets for others. Posters of the mysteries to share between classes. Classes will be encouraged to pray the rosary monthly and more during the months of May and October. Posters \$35, Large Rosaries \$100, small rosaries \$60
<b>St. Kateri</b>	Rosary Club will meet once a week January to March. Two teachers will guide the group. Rosaries will be made by the students to donate to a ministry that the children will decide upon, they will also make a bracelet rosary to keep and pray with. Students will learn about the prayers of the rosary and the saints Mary has visited. Supplies \$195
<b>St. Michael</b>	Student Rosaries – During May the school celebrates the Month of Mary in their Metis School Learning Model. They will learn about the rosary and each student will make their own rosary. They will have discussion around the rosary and faith.
<b>St. Paul</b>	Living Rosary – Students will learn the history of the rosary, learn prayers that accompany the rosary and how to make a rosary. Club gatherings will take place in the library (social distanced) Crucifixes \$13, Cord \$13, beads \$145
<b>Sister O'Brien</b>	School-wide Rosary Make and Pray Activity and Weekly Decade – March 25 during the Feast of the Annunciation. Tuning in virtually students will learn more about having a devotion to the rosary. The activity will begin with a blessing of Holy Water, the hymn Immaculate Mary, an invocation of the Saints, special intentions. Medals & Crosses \$110, Cord \$40, Pamphlets \$130
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<p><b>Bishop Murray</b></p>	<p>Grade 12 Retreat Rosaries – Grade 12 students will make rosaries and journey pouches to aid them where their journey may take them. Materials \$65.00, Busing \$130</p>
<p><b>E.D. Feehan</b></p>	<p>EDF Chaplain will go into the Catholic Studies classes to teach about the rosary and make rosaries out of twine with knots. Classes will spend time praying the rosary weekly to foster identity in school and their faith.</p>
<p><b>St. Joseph</b></p>	<p>Rosary – Making and Praying. Catholic Studies classes will make rosaries for the Diocesan Office to be delivered to the homebound, the sick, the psychiatric centre, jail and wherever the Diocese sees the need. Supplies \$195</p>
